# BIBLEWAY Q&A

**Q** – In an age of progressivism, political sparring, religious pluralism, and moral compromise, is the gospel still relevant?

A – It is tempting to view our world in 2D rather than 3D. That is, we tend to view every problem exclusively from a political, psychological, economic, or even ecological perspective. We reason if only the right leader with the right credentials and the right position could gain a large enough following and implement the right policies, then everything would be right again. This viewpoint is flawed because despite the greatness of men, it casts hope for transformation upon a person with inherent limitations, shortcomings, blind spots, and sins.

More than 700 years before Christ, the prophet Isaiah experienced God's call for his life. The event occurred after the death of the great King Uzziah. This king might have been considered a superstar. He had reigned for 52 years, bringing almost unprecedented prosperity to Israel. Now, he was gone.

Though an earthly king had passed away, the King of the Universe reminded Isaiah He was still alive and well. God showed Isaiah a vision of Himself on His throne. Surrounding the Sovereign were angels shouting His praises. Their words captivated Isaiah: "Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of Hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory."

At that moment, Isaiah awakened to a renewed realization of his own sinfulness. Like dirt on a windshield is exposed in sunlight, Isaiah's flaws became readily apparent in light of the glory of God. The presence of greatness humbled him. He could no longer point his finger at the culture around him, the political climate, the previous administration, or new leadership as the source of his problems. He had to look in the mirror.

The instant Isaiah saw the glory of God, the problems facing his beloved nation faded into obscurity. It wasn't that Israel didn't have problems anymore; they just seemed much smaller. In seeing the Lord, Isaiah saw his need! The King of Kings had none of the limitations and flaws of Israel's other rulers. He was and is the Answer to every question and the Solution to every problem Israel faced, politically, morally, and spiritually. He offers Himself as the Solution to our deepest problems — sin and its offspring, Death — as well. By His death and resurrection, He declared victory over these enemies.

The heart of the gospel is good news about God in a world filled with bad news. Is this message still relevant? Yes, as long as people continue seeking truth on their

own terms; as long as men and women enthrone and trust in Self above God. These paths lead to brokenness, shallowness, pain, despair, defeat, and ultimately, death. Only when they see Jesus in His glory will they realize their need! Those who believe in Him are invited to walk in victory and experience the freedom of life under His influence. The gospel matters.
